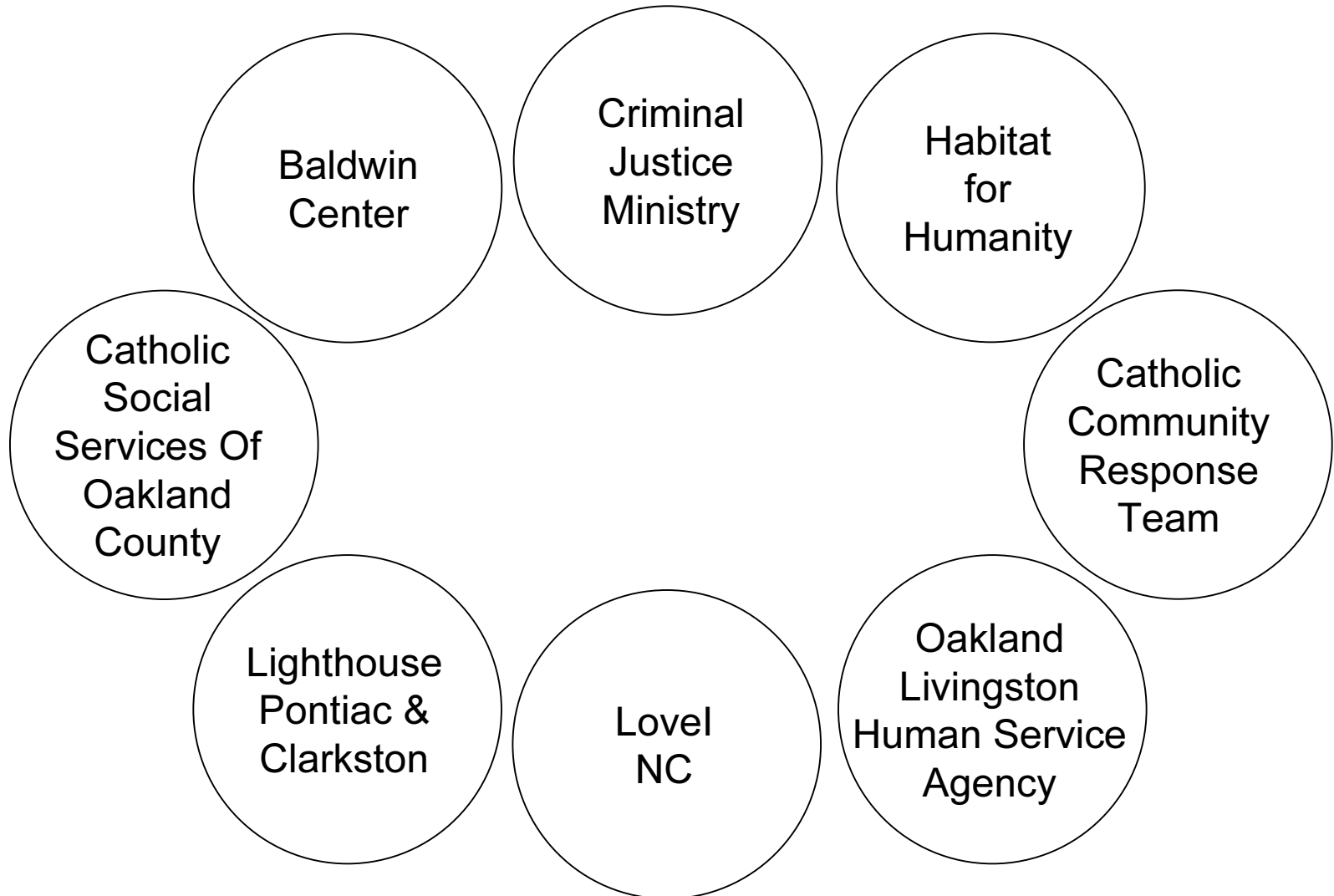


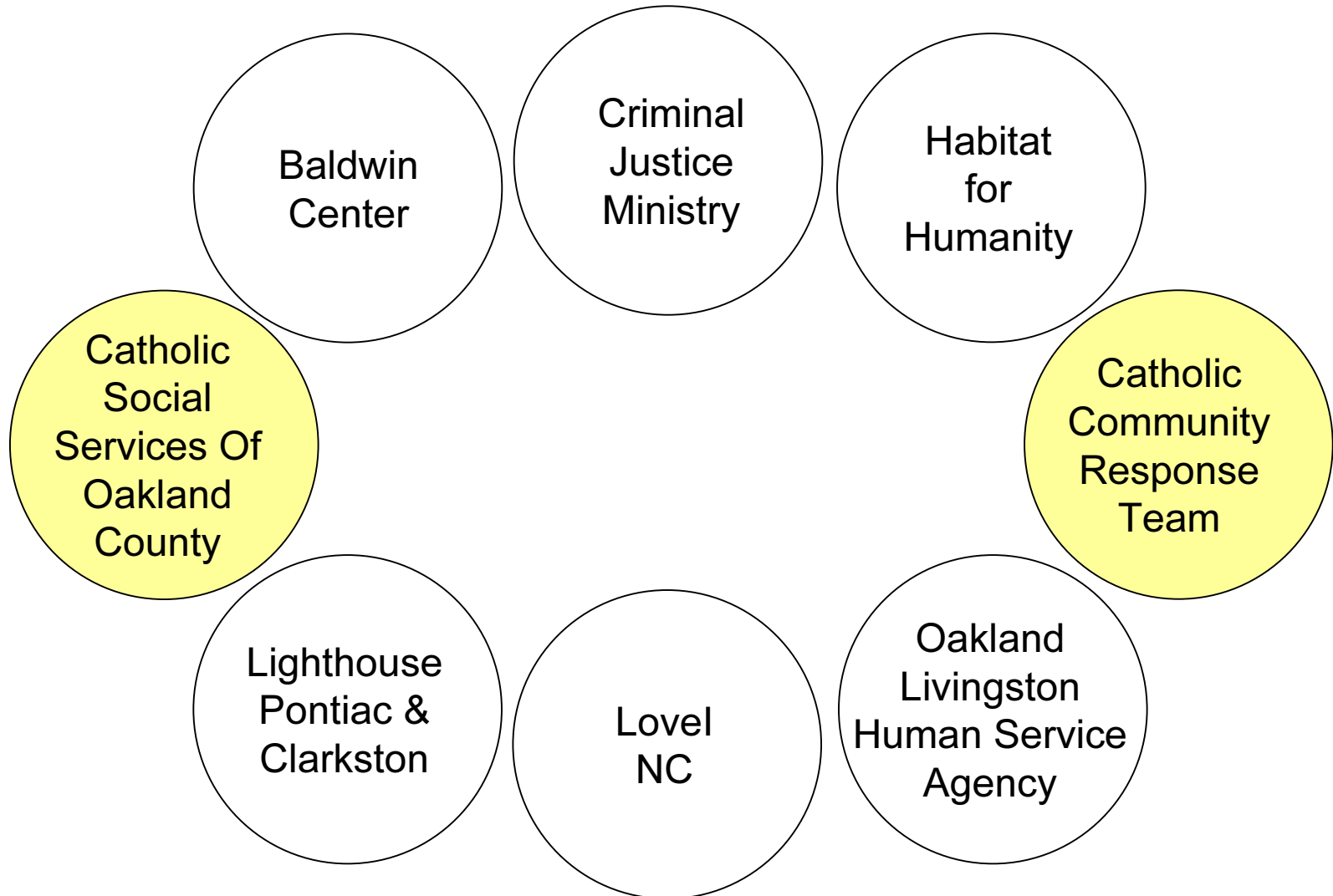

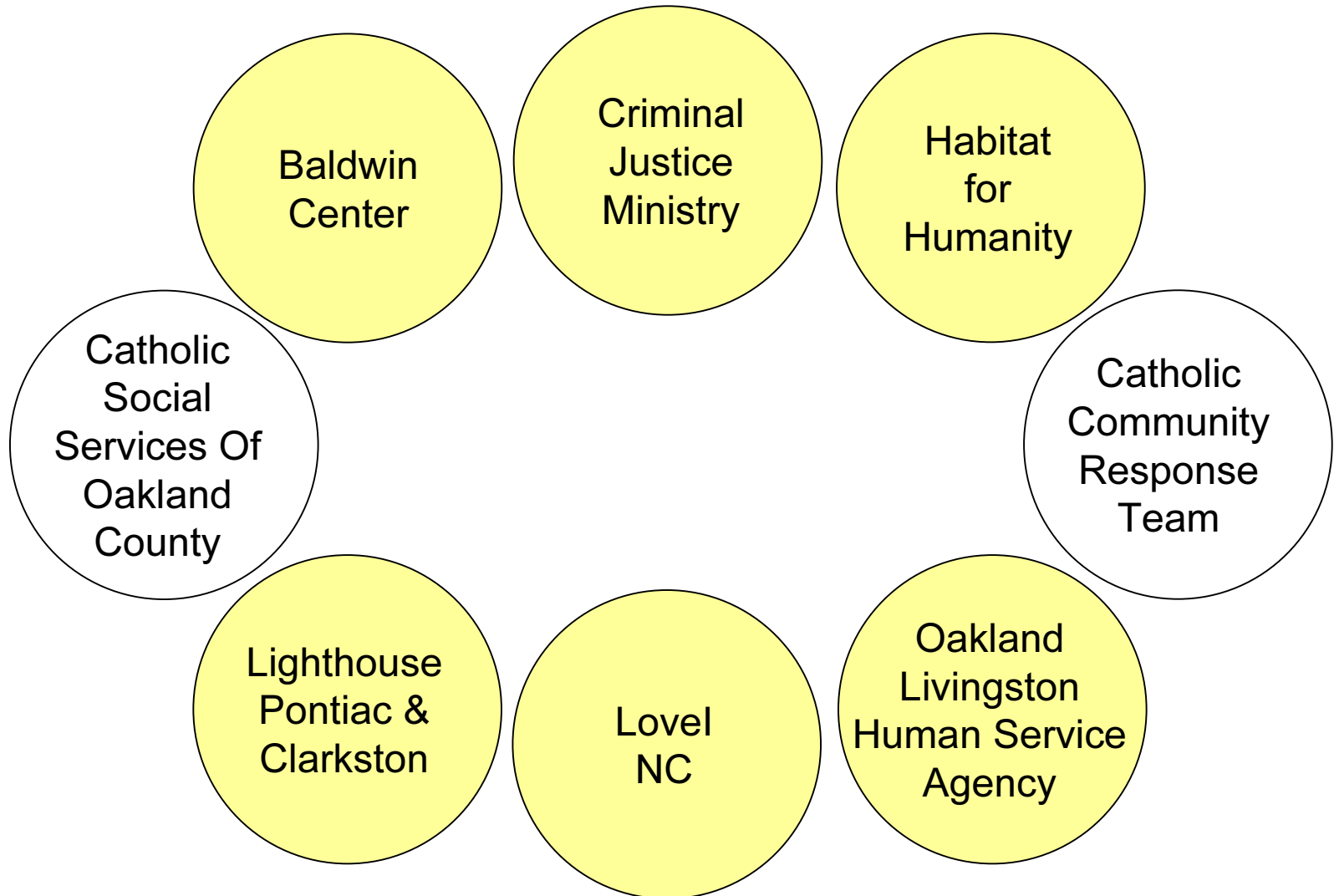

SERVICES PROVIDED: Lighthouse Emergency Services provides service for those who need food, housing, utility, and medical assistance. Homelessness prevention programs are provided for women and children. Case management programs are provided for chronically homeless individuals and families. Senior services program provides case management to seniors aged 60 plus and disabled individuals aged 55 plus to remain independent in their homes for as long as possible. Fresh fruits and vegetables, liquid nutrition, and Focus Hope delivery to homebound seniors are provided.
